TEXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT:

- E.D. Gober indicates that last month's Res #21-117 contained a clerical error and that Res #21-119 corrects that clerical error. Jeffery Daniels, Esq. indicates that Res #21-117 had incorrectly listed the contract to Journey Contracting and then awarded the contract to Tortorice Contractors. Jeffery Daniels, Esq. indicates HAGC could not legally award the contract to Journey Contractors as they were not the lowest responsive bidder. The lowest responsive bidder was Tortorice Contractors and Res #21-119 clarifies the record and properly awards the contract to Tortorice Contractors.
- E.D. Gober indicates The DaVinci Group that inspected Deptford Park Apartments from a structural perspective provided a written report to HAGC summarizing that all is within acceptable construction tolerances.
- E.D. Gober indicates the Shepherd's Farm Roofing job has been overseen by AHO and the contractor has advised they are 100% done. AHO and the Consultant inspected and had some punch list items, which the contractors completed and AHO will go back on site to check the completion of the punch list items.
- E.D. Gober advises that Shepherd's Farm year end was September 30th, their audit is in draft form and the exit conference is scheduled.
- E.D. Gober indicates that Res #21-120, #21-121 and #21-122 recommend professional staff for Legal, Development Consultant and Audit services.
- E.D. Gober indicates that Rowan College of South Jersey obtained on November 3rd preliminary and final site plans from Deptford Township, the funding application is being reviewed by underwriting at the HMFA and we have submitted a draw request for predevelopment expenses to the County. Our process is that once we create the request we submit to consultant for review and the consultant then submits the request to the County.
- E.D. Gober indicates GHA's groundbreaking ceremony has taken place November 19, 2021, E.D. Gober thanks all available to attend.
- E.D. Gober and AHO Director, Paul Letizia indicate there is a water leak at Carino Park Apartments involving the jockey pump. The Board is asked to deem this an emergency, E.D. Gober indicates this issue does meet the State's criteria of an emergency as it can affect the health and safety of residents. AHO Director, Paul Letizia also performed an independent price check on the needed equipment.
- E.D. Gober indicates the Build Back Better act has passed the House and is now with the Senate, it is anticipated the Senate will make changes to then be sent back to the House before being in front of the President. E.D. Gober indicates we are still operating under a continuing resolution that expires December 3rd, an extension is believed to be inevitable.
- E.D. Gober indicates the debt ceiling will be out by December 15th, we will keep and eye on this. We continue to advocate for our causes and housing funding.
- E.D. Gober indicates HAGC's next meeting will be held a week early on December 15th.
- E.D. Gober indicates HAGC is working on a FEMA application from Hurricane Ida, our request is around \$18K.
